August 10, 2021

Break out session – Education Toni, Sarah, Gary, Kelly, Kate, Donnan

Sarah Hamilton provided an overview of our proposed education strategic plan.

- 1) Media Literacy
- 2) Storytelling and Civic Education and Self Expression
- 3) Technical Skills

Discussed building future readiness skills (career readiness). Building student capacity to develop content and share stories.

Recommendations from the Advisory Board members:

- Develop mentorship program so that students understand the resources of WPSU and can present to school board
- Focus on literacy; connection between reading and writing; students lack focus on writing –
 critical to understanding reading. PA standards reading, writing, listening, speaking. Literacy
 could become a huge focal point. How can teachers incorporate reading and writing podcasts,
 blogs, videos having students produce. Have teachers understand how writing is
 incorporated.
- Career Readiness businesses need to invest in this; have businesses come into circle –
 important for WPSU /teachers to know what businesses need students to know; teachers need
 to know what is needed
 - Continue to focus on civic education intertwined into literacy in career development' deliver content through literacy education
- Create communities of teachers; get them working together and share resources across communities and classrooms

Community Outreach Breakout Session Board of Representatives Meeting August 10, 2021

- Partnering with Our Town Kane group who did story at a family drive-in
- We are looking at new interface system (in air), such as datacasting
- Need a "yes" person, technical support, and coordinator for paperwork
- What do we need to get to the kids who have no internet
- We are a team of 3-4 people, hard to say yes to everything, have to find a focus
- Need partners when we don't have capacity for projects
- Need to do things to bring partners together
- We have offered teacher webinars, but have not had much response (teachers want to attend on work time, not in evenings)
- Working on Movies in the Park with Park District (hundreds of families have signed up for the movies)

Development Committee Breakout Session Notes

8/10/21

Rob's Welcome:

- Ron's presentation relates to Development in how we can fund some of the projects he talked about.
- Our theme for discussion today is: Taking stock of where WPSU is and where we want to be
- Distinction with Development is that it is private philanthropy vs. the public funds that Ron was talking about
- We've had a very strong year across all of OOE Development—broke the receipts record set 20 years ago (FY02)—corollary is that FY02 had a worldwide event (9/11) as did FY21 (COVID pandemic)—this may have inspired people to give who maybe wouldn't have otherwise
- Today let's focus on where we need to be as a private philanthropy organization:

Spencer – we have had a big growth in foundation support. This has been a weak spot for PSU over the years, but OOE has taken the lead.

 Getting access to rural communities could be a great way to get private foundations involved for support

Rob – support has come from foundations recently such as the New York Life Foundation

- Looking to grow with local foundations within the WPSU coverage area.
- This is an area of focus for Lori Smeigh
- There are many foundations that exist under the radar that could be great funding partners for WPSU
 - o i.e. Louis Silvi Foundation that has been discovered as a partner for Shaver's Creek.
 - As a board, let's think about connections to those private foundations.

Melinda – in a lot of our small towns, we have those individuals who are high level folks moving from other places that may be under the radar to us (i.e. John Pozza's connection he mentioned during his flash talk)

Rob – a fundraising program we continue to grow is in the area of gift planning

- We've seen success with building this program (adding WPSU to their wills)
- Our advantage is having the access to the Office of Gift Planning at Penn State
 - We have an assigned liaison (Steve Blake)
 - Gift Planning is very complex, so we are fortunate to have this resource
- We want to continue to grow this program and others to get this idea out to people of ways other than a traditional membership contribution for individuals to give:

- Vehicle Donation
- Donate proceeds from property sale
- IRA distribution

Melinda – should we think broader than our central PA footprint for finding donors to WPSU (such as individuals who grew up here)

"How do you give back to who gave you your start?"

Rhonda – Could we reach out to former interns who are grateful for the start that they got at the station

Jen – Knows someone who recently set up an endowment at WPSU and spoke to them about it

- Person said that it was due to the sale of property and they had above and beyond what they needed to live their lifestyle
 - There may be others who are moving to retirement communities who are also in this
 position so we should get information about how to support WPSU in these ways to
 them

Spencer - through the Gift Planning office we should get info also in the hands of financial advisors

Jessica – we are continuing to promote gift planning in our messaging including Estate Planning Awareness Week (which is the week following FM pledge). We also have a buckslip in the August and September additional gift and lapsed donor letters to TV (August) and FM (September) to provide information and Rob's contact info for adding WPSU to estate plans

Rob – Provost asked Tracey what our level of state funding is and if that funding goes away, what kind of endowment would be needed to cover if that funding went away

Interesting to think on this level and perhaps begin to approach higher level donors

Don – PNC Bank Foundation gives millions to the University but nothing right now to WPSU. But we know that they fund programming at other stations, so we are working to get connected through the proper University channels to be included in asks for funding

Jen – the University connection is great on many levels but does make fundraising complicated

Spencer – University acts as a "traffic cop" so foundations don't get bombarded

Rob – good to remember the University is our single largest benefactor
